Experienced Journalist Hamdy Rizk, carried out a 5-day workshop for senior Political Mass Media Students at the Faculty of Economics and Political Science-Future University in Egypt.

The workshop focused on issues such as credibility, language and dialect, target audience, editing the press message electronically and on radio and television. The workshop also discussed the issue of the use and integration of several different media such as (text, audio, graphics, animation, video, and interactive applications) to present content in an interactive manner to achieve one or more specific information goals.

Fake News and Disinformation

During the morning show on Nile tv International on November 3rd, 2023, Dr. Sahar Talaat, an Assistant Professor of political mass media at the Faculty of Economics and Political Science-FUE, discussed media coverage of the Gaza Crisis.

Since the beginning of the Gaza Crisis, the dissemination of information that may or may not be verified has been a major problem around the world. The receiver came to realize that social media pushes highlighted agendas without offering alternatives for locating legitimate resources in Arab media or the perspective of foreign media, both of which fall short of accurately portraying the political and humanitarian reality in Gaza.

Dr. Sahar argues that media outlets cannot tell the difference between true and fake news without a technological verification team reviewing information sources and selecting content carefully. Reporters and journalists have an ethical responsibility to report the news objectively.

Young people are profoundly affected by what they see, but they also need to learn how to independently check news and visuals and craft a nuanced message free from media manipulation. They need to be able to spot fake news and articulate their opinions in a variety of languages.
